Professor Bill Jahnel spoke in opposition to the GE Subcommittee's proposal to remove American History and Institutions and Health from the core local requirements.

Jonathan Walker, a former student of Palomar College, spoke in support of Chair Bill Jahnel, clarifying that at a time of political uncertainty and issues regarding minority representation, maintaining American History and Institutions as a core requirement is important and should be kept in the curriculum.

VP Barnes is looking for anyone who is interested in joining a pepper eating contest as he is looking for more participants. This contest is hosted by Chess Club and will occur during their next meeting on Tuesday, March 17. Please let VP Barnes know if you are interested in participating.

a. **Executive Reports – Three (3) Minutes Each**

Attended College Council this past Tuesday, made sure to highlight DC and the advocacy done throughout the trip. Worked alongside EVP Hussain throughout the week to onboard the new members of ASG.

- ii. Executive Vice President Rabab Hussain

EVP Hussain reported completed two onboardings this past week and reminded new ASG members to reach out to VP Hussain, VP Penning, or President Yaretzi Hernandez to complete the onboarding process. She also attended the Student Equity Plan & Pathways Oversight Committee, where discussion centered on supporting disproportionate impacted students. She expressed she was glass to see efforts being made to assist these students.

b. **Trustee Report – Three (3) Minutes**

i. Trustee Fridman

Attended Governing Board meeting this week, every constituent group and party had the same concerns about enrollment at Palomar College. Enrollment is supposed to be increasing, but this semester enrollment has plateaued. Financially, a decrease in engagement has thereby decreased the funding received from newly enrolled students. Because of this, the Budget Committee has discussed preemptively cutting some programs. Trustee Fridman noted that ASG needs to look into ways to spark engagement at Palomar College to get more people to become interested. Additionally, she noted that the construction going on between the H building and the library is due to an emergency regarding a faulty pipe. Trustee Fridman also approved the timeline for the Presidential Search Committee; the speaker will be coming to an ASG meeting hopefully in a few weeks. She announced that during the Governing Board, Dean Amrik Johal received recognition in addition to the receiving of a grant to create opportunities for non-traditional learners and translate veterans' and active duty service members' experience into credits for college. She has been working on the Memorial Committee, reminding that the March Madness event is next Tuesday, March 17 from 11AM-1PM. She has met with the Athletics Department to discuss mini giveaways for retired equipment and expressed their excitement for future collaborations. She also met with VP Yatooma, the VP of Finance of Palomar College and are in talks about funding for a commemorative bench.

c. **Advisor Reports – Three (3) Minutes Each**

i. Stephanie Linnander

Advisor Stephanie Linnander expressed appreciation to everyone for being here this week and for their engagement this past month. In two weeks, ASG will be travelling to San Francisco for the SSCCC General Assembly, which VP Penning has a presentation scheduled for today's meeting. Yesterday, certain ASG members attended March in March in Sacramento. Advisor Linnander gave kudos to VP Harris, VP Miller, and VP Penning for their work and meetings with the offices of Senator Jones and Senator Alvarez. She is incredibly impressed with the preparation and advocacy, with many items from committee meetings such as the Budget Committee and other areas of discussion in College Council being brought up to the state. Concerns such as the funding formula, budget shortfalls, advocacy for students with disabilities, and workforce programs were brought up to the state level. She reminded ASG members that the work done in committees is important, but it is also important to share information so it is highlighted in the appropriate circumstances. She reminded ASG members as the semester gets busy, school is the most important priority amidst midterms and ASG work. If assistance is needed in balancing work, please let advisor Stephanie Linnander know as she wants to encourage that balance. She also reminded ASG members that there is elections for upcoming year ahead. The intention statement is due next Monday, the 16th and the signatures for student endorsement are due April 17th.

e. **Committee Reports – Three (3) Minutes Each**

i. Internal Affairs

The Internal Affairs Committee will have a special meeting next week next Thursday at 3PM. VP Penning wants to meet with the Committee one more time before heading to the General Assembly. Before attending the General Assembly, he wishes to hear more of our voices as he values what ASG as a whole thinks.

ii. Communications

VP Miller reported attending March in March and met with the offices of Senator Jones and Senator Alvarez. During the event, she advocated funding for education and participated in a march around the Capitol for free education. She also completed the first ASG newsletter and distributed physical copies to those present.

iii. Finance

VP Harris attended College Council this morning, where members approved campus safety policies, reviewed the midyear report, and received a food pantry and budget update. He also attended March in March and advocated for a problem that is seen across the state. The state is not fully funding the growth that community colleges in California are experiencing for full time equivalent student enrollment. This past fiscal year, 27,000 insufficient available revenue with a deficit of approximately \$75,000,000. VP Harris noted that Assemblymember David Alvarez is an ideal point of contact for this problem as he serves as chair of the Assembly Budget Subcommittee on Education Finance. Regarding Palomar College's enrollment numbers, VP Harris noted it is continuing to grow but not at the desired rate. He plans on scheduling a meeting with Nellie Martinez, the outreach manager of Palomar College, to review the overall budget and predicted expenses for upcoming outreach events, including logistics for engaging students through incentive opportunities such as providing gas cards. He then plans to bring back this information to the Budget Committee.

iv. Inter-Club Council

ICC is currently working on updating the bulletin boards downstairs in the area below the ASG room. VP Barnes also plans to send out surveys to better serve clubs. He expressed plans in creating an ICC Canvas page to post announcements, as well as an accessible calendar featuring all events and important dates. He noted that email will serve as a backup communication method as it is not the preferred primary means of communication.

v. Rules

EVP Hussain has gotten significant work done in the Rules Committee. She noted that the scheduled meeting today will only be 30 minutes. She has worked on ICC eligibility points but is currently on hold. During the last Rules Committee meeting, she included VP Ruis, VP Barnes, and Senator Crouch to help write up an Amendment regarding Chancellor's eligibility. She also has been working on the wording and revising bylaws in the Constitution but is seeking other individuals to look for mistakes.

vi. Events

VP Ruiz substituted for VP Penning at the last College Council meeting. She also met with the Chair of Sustainability, who expressed interest in including ASG in the upcoming Earth Week event scheduled for April 20-23. VP Ruiz selected Wednesday and Thursday for ASG to participate during the event. She also met with Dan regarding the basketball team and the DRC who wants to unveil their golf cart with LaCraigory Garrett's name during the March Madness event.
