She is getting ready for the upcoming trip to D.C. and working alongside EVP Hussain to do outreach with ICC ambassadors. Attended college council this morning with VP Penning and VP Harris.

- ii. Executive Vice President Rabab Hussain

Talked with David Viar alongside President Yaretzi Hernandez to converse about a new college president. Discussed possible criteria such as being present and attending all meetings.

Attended special governing board meeting at Rancho Bernardo, talked about the hiring process for the new college president. Informed those who don't know that the old college president has left and now in the works of establishing a Search Committee to look for a new president. She is planning on showing ASG a timeline of what is to come. There will be three student positions on the Search Committee; a student is eligible if they are not transferring next fall and will be at Palomar College. The committee will meet every so often to discuss interview questions, criteria, etc. Additionally, informed ASG about issues with criteria for the superintendent

position on lessening the qualifications for the position. Please let Trustee Fridman know your opinion on this matter. After the governing meeting, Trustee Rodriguez asked for student representatives to come up to Oceanside and talk about the experience at Palomar College.

All important details are in the elections packet. Worked on a newsletter for ASG this week, which VP Miller plans on continually releasing the first Monday of every month. Will have first newsletter out in the beginning of March. Met with ICC Ambassador Dominic Jebrail to converse about adding a 'Frequently Asked Questions' section to Palomar College's ICC website as many clubs have come with various questions. She also has been working with VP Barnes on creating a form for clubs to submit mini summaries, wants to do something similar with ASG's committees to inform others on what ASG has been working on. Will be sending out forms soon and continue working on it during the Communications Committee.

iii. Finance

VP Harris has been preparing for the upcoming D.C. trip. He also created the shadow budgets which will be reviewed and finalized during the Finance Committee in hopes of creating and bringing a presentation to the next board meeting. Also attended college council, with key topics such as student concerns and upcoming Solidarity Fest. He addressed that faculty members have been brought with concerns by students about immigration enforcement. They created a one-page document in response to the concerns to let students know the steps needed to be taken if enforcement comes to the campus. Additionally, there will be a Strength & Solidarity Fest run by PFF and CCE. Interested in possibly partnering with ICC and Events to build community. As of right now, there has been a student enrollment issue at Palomar College and the goal for this event is to show what life is like at Palomar College to perspective students and families in the community.

VP Barnes sat with faculty senate, talked about college politics. He is working towards getting a bulletin board for ICC. Additionally, he plans to attend meetings to help advocate and push College Hour. In the works on recruiting a Vice-Chairperson and Secretary for ICC.

He informs that delegates would still be the lowest priority but will be given an opportunity with the chance of an empty space.
