*Bill Jahnelt has come to present a contrasting view of the policy and procedures of the currently proposed GE changes, specifically the potential removal of American History and Institutions and Health and Fitness from Palomar's local general education requirements. He noted he has a medical condition which affects his speech, especially the longer he talks. He states it's perfectly okay to ask for clarity if it's difficult to understand his words. Additionally, he wants ASG to know that despite coming here to present a contrasting view for the currently proposed GE changes, he has deep respect for the work of his colleagues and states it is healthy academic discourse.*

*President Yaretzi Hernandez reported that the executive team attended the SSSCC General Assembly in San Francisco and did a wonderful job. She gave a shoutout to VP Penning for his outstanding work participating in the resolutions debate. Overall, she is proud of the work accomplished by the team. She also attended the grand opening of the Pride Center and watched Trustee Fridman deliver her speech. She encouraged all ASG members to visit the new Pride Center.*

*EVP Hussain apologized for her absence at the last meeting as it was the end of Ramadan, a holiday she observes. She reported that the General Assembly in San Francisco went well, especially regarding the preparation on the resolutions. She also reminded ASG about the End of Year Report in which she compiles. The report summarizes all events and activities ASG has held and accomplished over the course of the two semesters. She noted that in January, she created a shared folder where members can add pictures and written contributions to document their work done over the school year. She can also send the slideshow with*

*additional information to those who request it. She asked all members to begin contributing to the report so she can start working on it and finish by May.*

*Advisor Stephanie Linnander reported that she attended the General Assembly with eight ASG members. She highlighted the outstanding work of VP Penning for stepping into his role and the team for thoroughly reviewing the resolutions. She also expressed appreciation for the work done by ASG members. She commented on how VP Penning went with the sentiment of ASG as a whole and wanting to know others' opinions despite being the one to ultimately finalize the vote on resolutions. She also appreciated and commended the work of the San Francisco team who sacrificed many long nights and honoring LaCraigory Garrett. Furthermore, she met with VP Harris to begin budget development and had good turnout at the previous meeting. She also provided an update for ASG regarding accessibility and standards regarding Zoom. The approved quote ASG previously voted on had terminated their sales for that product and moved to an install-only model, meaning ASG can not move forward with the quote. Advisor Linnander will be working with VP Harris on coming up with a game plan and how best to move forward, encouraging members to join the shared governance community meetings in which these discussions will take place. Additionally, there is an Elections Orientation meeting today after ASG, which is required for all members who are running in the election. She reminded members that elections are approaching, and the Candidate Intention Statement Form is due today. Forms are available via email sent to all Palomar students and can also receive a copy from Stephanie's office. She noted that Student Life and Leadership is overwhelmingly busy with commencement planning and looks forward to an exciting close to the academic year.*

He noted that the ICC Secretary role involves more than just taking minutes, but also includes a variety of behind-the-scenes tasks such as design work, posting, and administrative support. He encouraged ASG members to consider applying. He also noted that there is sufficient funding available for the ICC budget reallocation and encouraged members to vote in favor of it.
